Wisconsin Philharmonic to Bring the Joy of Music to JanBoree

The Wisconsin Philharmonic will Frank Porto's "Casey at the Bat" is bring the joy of orchestral music to the 2018 Waukesha JanBoree, presenting a specially-designed Family Concert on Sun., Jan. 28 at 3 PM, at the newly-refurbished St. Luke's Lutheran Church, 300 Carroll Street in downtown Waukesha.

In the spirit of the theme "Game On!", the Philharmonic will present two classic, entertaining works for narrator and orchestra -- Russian composer Serge Prokofiev's PETER AND THE WOLF, and Frank Proto's more recent American classic, CASEY AT THE BAT. Guest Narrator will be, TODAY'S TMJ4 News Anchor, Charles Benson; Alexander Platt, the Wisconsin Philharmonic's Music Director, will conduct.

Prokofiev's "Peter and the Wolf," perhaps the most famous of all works composed especially for young audiences, tells the story of Peter, an enterprising young boy in the Russian countryside, who enlists the help of his many friends from the animal kingdom in order to safely ensnare the neighborhood's problematic local wolf, and lead it to the nearby zoo. Of more recent vintage, an ingenious setting for narrator and orchestra of Ernest Lawrence Thaver's immortal baseball poem of 1888, telling the melancholy tale of how "The Mighty Casey," star slugger of the Mudville Nine, finally gets his needed comeuppance. Thayer's poem may famously state that "There is no joy in Mudville," but Porto's setting results in a charming work of Americana that is a perfect marriage of two of the greatest American traditions -- classical music and baseball.

This concert will be a perfect way for families to introduce young children to the joy of symphonic music, and to the lifelong joy of playing an orchestral instrument. The 3 PM concert will last about an hour. The Instrument Petting Zoo will begin at 2 PM with Philharmonic musicians on hand to help children try the instruments for themselves. If your children would like to discover the world of the orchestra, then this concert is the perfect opportunity.


