Don't try this at home

Nerveless Nocks daredevil circus group promises extreme thrills for fairgoers

WAUKESHA — Are you an adrenaline junkie? Live vicariously through Nerveless Nocks, an extreme stunt group, which will be featured at the 2018 Waukesha County Fair.

This stunt show is known as Switzerland's original circus where it began in 1840 before making the move to America in 1934. Nerveless Nocks has been owned and operated by the Nock family for over nine generations. It is currently headquartered in Sarasota, Florida.

Nerveless Nocks thrill shows feature a variety of stunts, including one called Sway Poles in which daredevil Nocks scale 80-foot-tall poles, completely free of any safety measures, and perform stunts at the top.

Another act is known as the Wheel of Steel, or Wheel of Death, in which stunt artists fling themselves in the air off of a tall, spinning steel apparatus and perform a series of gymnastics tricks.

Michelangelo Nock, president and CEO of Nerveless Nocks, said that the Nocks' Waukesha County Fair show will feature many of their signature acts, including aerial gymnasts and extreme motorcyclists racing around each other in a steel cage. Nock said one of their more heart-pounding productions is called the "steel ball globe of thunder."

"It is truly a show for the whole family to enjoy," said Nock.

Throughout their 173 years of providing entertainment, the Nerveless Nocks have been a featured act all around the world. According to its website, some of the family's more iconic appearances include working for the Ringling Brothers Circus and performing on the Ed Sullivan show in the same episode that the Beatles first appeared. Nowadays, the thrill group has a long-standing relationship with the Tommy Bartlett show in the Wisconsin Dells and often performs there.

Nock said audiences are always awestruck by the end of the show, expressing disbelief and shock at the extreme stunts that Nerveless Nocks are able to pull off.

The Nerveless Nocks make the acts look easy, but it's something that's been practiced within the family for generations, said Nock.

"I tell people what I always do, which is don't try this at home!" said Nock.

Seeing the Nerveless Nocks is free with paid admission to the fair and the show can be found southwest of the Coors Stage.

Showtimes for July 18 to July 20 will be

at 4 p.m., 5:30 p.m. and 7 p.m. On July 21 showtimes will be at noon, 2 p.m., 4:30 p.m. and 6 p.m. Performances on July 22 will be held at 10:30 a.m., noon, 2 p.m., and 4:30 p.m. For more information on Nerveless Nocks'

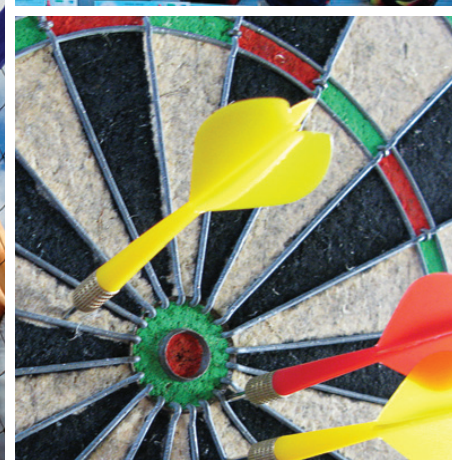

A lifetime of involvement with agriculture

Honorary fair marshal has worked with 4H for over 50 years

WAUKESHA — Patricia Richman, an avid member of 4-H and teacher by trade, will be serving as honorary fair marshal at this year's Waukesha County Fair.

Richman has spent over five decades involved in the world of agriculture. Her father, a dairy superintendent, and mother, a home economics teacher, were both involved in 4H, and Richman's journey with 4H began at the age of 9 when she started showing dairy cattle.

Her involvement with 4H, the Bark River Clovers group, helped her gain opportunities and knowledge that ultimately benefited her experiences at the Waukesha County Fair.

Richman's long history of involvement with 4H has allowed her the opportunity to witness the evolution of the Waukesha County Fair and see firsthand the influence it has on the community.

Her father, Willard Morris, acted as director on the fair board for several years,

and Richman credits her family as a heavy influence for her continued involvement with the fair.

Her past experience with the fair includes working at the admissions gate with her four brothers, showing animals, working as co-superintendent in the Junior Sheep Division for over 30 years, and becoming a 4H leader with her husband, Dennis, after having three sons who involved themselves with the organization, too.

Patricia has passed a love for agriculture on to her children, and their children as well. She believes that getting kids involved with 4H at a young age teaches them how to be life leaders.

"Because of 4H, kids are growing up with responsibilities, a work ethic, and learning to care for a living thing," Richman said.

She was humbled to receive the honor of being recognized as the fair's 2018 marshal and said her responsibilities will include promoting livestock and agriculture programs, and working with some animals.

Tesla's recently re-released the album with remastered live renditions, as well as a new single *"Save That Goodness."* Tesla's top songs include: *"Little Suzi," "Love Song,"* and *"Signs."*

Founded in 1983 by teenagers Erik Turner and Jerry Dixon, the band's first album hit big. That album included the songs “*Sometimes She Cries*” and “*Heaven*.” Their sophomore album, “*Cherry Pie*” had a single of the same name and made the group one of the top-grossing touring acts of 1991. Albums released in 2011 and 2017 put the band back on top Billboard music charts, and their recently recorded cover of Merle Haggard’s “*I Think I’ll Just Stay Here and Drink*” has been named the official song of the Professional Bull Riding Association.
