When it comes to home projects, one area expert says the wait for new supplies could go on for a while.

As supply chain-related delays and slowdowns impact a variety of industries, some types of products for home updates are not immune.

Lissa Rolenc, owner and creative director at 4 Design, LLC, said those planning to launch home renovation projects should expect delays for certain items.

"Right now, the shortage in raw materials is for paint," Rolenc said. "If anyone is starting a new project, you are not going to be able to paint until February or March."

4 Design LLC is based in the greater Milwaukee area and has completed projects throughout the United States. It bills itself on its website as a "full service, commercial interior design firm specializing in senior living and multi-family housing."

Slowed product distribution and rising prices for petrochemical companies are the result of a

NARI advises to get ready for winter

NARI Milwaukee is urging homeowners to take advantage of the relatively warm October weather to get their homes ready for the cold winter months ahead.

According to NARI members, if homeowners allocate a few hours over a weekend, they'll be able to take care of quite a few of the important items themselves and schedule contractors to handle those that need professional attention.

Randy Miller, owner of Allrite Home & Remodeling, a certified remodeler (CR) and member of NARI Milwaukee, suggests homeowners walk around their home to visually inspect it, take notes and add items to their list.

"It's essential to take a good look at your gutters and remove any leaves, sticks and other debris that's accumulated in them and the downspouts," says Miller. "During the winter, those obstructions can cause water to back up and form ice dams, which can damage roofs."

Homeowners should also position downspouts correctly and, if needed, lengthen them so they direct water at least 5 feet away from the house in order to minimize the possibility of water run-off damaging the foundation and seeping into the basement.

Other outside fall "to do's" include:

- Remove and drain outside hoses, store them inside and shut off exterior water valves.
- Check the dryer vent to make sure the filter is clean and free of leaves and other dobris
- Cover the air conditioner condensing unit outside and remove inside window units.
- Seal concrete cracks to prevent water from entering the cracks, freezing, expanding and turning a small crack into a bigger one
- Rake all leaves from the lawn to avoid dead patches of grass next spring.

"Turning off exterior water valves is especially important," said Jessie Cannizzaro, owner of Milestone Plumbing. "When temps dip below zero for an extended length of time, water that's in the exterior valves can freeze and burst interior pipes, which can lead to major expenditure on plumbing."

Things to check inside

Fall is also a good time to think about a home's insulation and energy efficiency from top to bottom.



At the top of the home, don't forget about the attic.

"Go into your attic and check the thickness of the insulation," suggests Miller. "It should be 16-18 inches deep. Not only does insulation keep your home warm, it prevents heat from escaping through the roof, which is another factor in preventing ice dams."

When heat leaks from a roof, it melts the rooftop snow, which then runs down the roof and can freeze in gutters and under shingles. In addition to roof problems, the water can damage ceilings and walls inside the home.

And, even though it's in the basement and out of sight, homeowners should pay attention to their furnace. That means changing the filter regularly and getting a yearly furnace tune up.

It's also important to check for and appropriately seal drafty windows and doors with caulk since small air leaks can add up to significant heat loss and higher energy bills. In older homes, fall is the time to replace window screens with storm windows and install the storm door. If any pipes or ducts travel through an exterior wall of the house, caulk and weather-stripping can help keep cold air out.

For a thorough evaluation of how to make a home airtight and energy efficient, consider a home-energy assessment. High-tech tools such as infrared cameras are used to identify where heat is escaping and cold air is entering. A detailed report provides recommendations on ways to save energy while improving the comfort, longevity and safety of the home. In some cases, Focus on Energy provides rebates for energy efficient improvements that homeowners make.

Fireplace safety

A chimney inspection and cleaning is another smart move before cold weather settles in.

According to Howard Rowell, a master sweep, owner of Royal Chimney Service and a member of NARI Milwaukee, a chimney inspection and cleaning takes approximately an hour and includes both the indoor and outdoor elements of the chimney – flue, smoke chamber, smoke shelf, damper, firebox, chimney liner, bricks, crown, flashing, cap and mortar joints.

It's not just woodburning fireplaces that should be checked.

"Gas fired fireplace inserts and direct vent gas fireplaces also require an annual inspection and cleaning to remove creosote and carbon deposits on the ignition surface, burner and safety sensing controls," says Rowell. "We also inspect the chimney flue and vent for nesting material from birds, squirrels, wasps and bees."

variety of factors, from the pandemic to a winter freeze in Texas, lighting strike in Louisiana and hurricanes on the Gulf Coast, according to an Associated Press report published in late

Shortages are being felt in particular by big contractors needing same-colored paint for apartment complexes and major projects, the

Another area experiencing a slowdown is the furniture industry, according to Rolenc.

"The other delay I'm seeing is furniture. We're looking at almost six months lead time," she said.

One of Rolenc's customers recently sold their home and furniture before a move and since then haven't been able to procure new

"This couple moved into a new house and now they have no furniture," she said.

Rolenc also noted that there have been a series of mergers in carpet companies, which may impact carpet availability.

Furniture delays are a global problem, according to a recent report by Bloomberg

The report said long wait times on furniture are occurring across the nation, the United Kingdom and a host of other countries.

'Companies say unique headwinds have resulted in delays: a combination of Covidrelated problems, increased demand for housing, extreme weather and an unexpected foam shortage," the report said.

Those looking at new construction homes in the coming months will need to be prepared, according to Rolenc. Maybe see what furniture family members have stashed in their basements that can be used for the present, she

"Just plan ahead. Don't think if you're building a new house and you're going to buy all new furniture and have it tomorrow." Rolenc

There are slowdowns in shipping, as well, according to Rolenc, who said some items will ship and then be held up at an interim loca-

"Something will leave Ohio and then go to Tennessee and then it sits in a terminal for two to three weeks," she said.

There are some home project products that are not experiencing supply chain slowdowns,

"I haven't had any issues with kitchen cabinets or vanity cabinets. A lot of those companies are local. And countertops haven't been an issue," said Rolenc.

"A lot of vinvl plank and tiles are made here in the U.S.," she said.

Rolenc advised that homeowners consider how particular they are about projects before starting out.

The AP report said analysts expect the petrochemical crunch to last into 2022. Rolenc is hearing that costs may start coming down around the first of the year.

"And I'm hearing the supply chain should be back to normal by the end of February," she

"Just be patient. Everybody is trying to do their best. People in the trades are overworked and overbooked," Rolenc said.
