Popular Spaces in Post-Pandemic Homes

The pandemic changed our lives, especially the time spent at home. Many homeowners have reevaluated what areas in their home they would like to modernize to fit their changing needs. What are the most sought out designated spaces buyers are looking for in new homes? According to a survey of recent and prospective home buyers by the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB), spaces for working out, working from home and outdoor spaces are among the most wanted specialty areas in a new home.

As individuals begin to return to work, some employers are allowing their employees to continue working from home in a full- or part-time capacity. Therefore, it is no surprise that the survey revealed that a majority (63 percent) of homebuyers want a home office. Home offices are particularly popular among the millennial age group (74 percent) and married couples with children (70 percent). In terms of size, the study found that a majority (77 percent) of the buyers who want a home office would like the space to be at least 100 square feet, which is smaller than the average size of a bedroom, or larger.

Another trend among homebuyers, likely accelerated by the pandemic, was the request for an exercise room. Nearly half of all home buyers (47 percent) rated an exercise room as essential or desirable, according to NAHB's survey. When this question was asked in 2003, 27 percent of buyers wanted an exercise room, a full 20 percentage points lower than the current response. A majority of millennials (61 percent) and Gen Xers (62 percent) were among the age groups most interested in this space.

With more time spent at home this year, getting some fresh air and spending time outside the home grew in popularity. A majority of homebuyers in the survey ranked a patio (87 percent) and a front porch (81 percent) among the top essential features in a home. An expanded outdoor space can help homeowners enjoy nature, relax, and safely entertain while social distancing.



Cleaning up the competition, NAHB's survey showed that a laundry room is the most wanted specialty room, with 87 percent of home buyers rating it essential or desirable. Make a List of Potential Builders

With so many companies to choose from, the best first step is to make a list of potential builders. The Metropolitan Builders Association features a list of local, reputable home builders and remodelers that can be found on FindAnMBAMember.com. If you want to add more names to your list, consider reviewing the real estate section of the local newspaper for builders and projects. Many builders advertise what type of homes they construct and may offer a price range. Another great source is local real estate agents or asking friends and relatives for recommendations.

Ask Questions

Once you've generated a robust list of potential builders, reach out and ask questions. You can start by asking about associated costs in the short and long term such as financing options, fees, homeowner's association dues, and estimated taxes on the property. Don't forget to secure references of recent buyers. A professional builder will be able to provide you with names and contact information of customers. When you connect with a reference, talk to them about their experience working with the builder in terms of planning, timelines and budgeting.

Get to Know Your Builder

Once you've narrowed down your list, make sure the home builder has substantial experience building the type of home you want. You can ask to see model homes, example floor plans, and design options. Some builders have professional designations which is a sign that the builder has expertise in a specific area of building, for example, Certified Green Builder (CGP).

Establish Communication Expectations

Before you agree to work with a home builder, make sure to establish communication expectations. You both should agree on how often to connect to discuss updates throughout the project. It is best to determine what communication channel (email, text, or phone) fits your needs. Taking this small but important step will help eliminate any confusion in the home building process and avoid damaging your relationship with your builder.



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Checklist for Finding and Hiring a Builder or Remodeler

Doing your homework will help you have a more successful experience.

Use this checklist to help you select a home builder or home remodeler to work on or build your home:

- Contact the Metropolitan Builders Association for the names of member builders and remodelers: MBAbuilds.org. You can also ask family, friends, or coworkers for recommendations.
- Make sure the builder or home remodeler has a permanent business location and a good reputation with local banks and suppliers.
- Find out how long they have been in the building business. It usually takes three to five years to establish a financially sound business. You want to make sure they will be around after the construction is complete to service any warranties.

Check out the company's rating and if there have been any complaints filed with your local Better Business Bureau: www.bbb.org.

Make sure the builder/remodeler is licensed and has sufficient workers compensation and general liability insurance. If not, you may be liable for any construction-related accidents on your premises.

- Ask the builder/remodeler to provide you with names of previous customers. If they won't, beware. If they do, ask the customers if they would hire the builder/remodeler again.
- Ask if you can see the builder/remodelers work, both completed and in progress. Check for quality of workmanship and materials.
- Do you feel you can easily communicate with the builder/remodeler? Remember you will be in close contact with them throughout the construction process and afterward as you live in your new home.
- Make sure the builder/remodeler provides you with a complete and clearly written contract. The contract will benefit both of you. If you are having a new home built, get and review a copy of the home warranty and homeowner manual as well.
- Be cautious of unusually low-priced bids. If the builder/remodeler is unable to pay for the materials and labor as the project proceeds, this may indicate a potential problem. Keep in mind that less expensive does not necessarily mean better!

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



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
