A RESIDENT is any person who LIVES WITHIN THE CORPORATE CITY LIMITS of West Bend. This is not to be confused with a West Bend Area School District Resident. City and School District boundaries are not the same. A NON-RESIDENT is anyone who lives outside the City limits. Even if your mailing address is West Bend, this does not mean you are a Corporate City Resident. Most activities have different fees for residents and non-residents. The Parks, Recreation & Forestry Department is supported by the residents of the City of West Bend through taxes. Non-residents pay their fair share through an additional surcharge established by the Park and Recreation Commission.

Refund Policy

Credits or Refunds will be made under the following conditions:

- 1. If the Department cancels the activity or is unable to fulfill your request, a full credit/refund will be made.
- 2. If you cancel prior to the start of an activity a \$5.00 administrative fee will be charged.

6 - SWIM LESSONS

Learn to Swim Program

۲

Please read the descriptions below to enroll your child in the appropriate level. If you are unsure of your child's level, please inquire at 335-5080. Our classes are set for the benefit and safety of your child. Children who are not toilet trained are required to wear swim diapers. Proper swim attire is required of all participants.

Parent/Tot

Requirements: Ages 6 months to 2 years

An adult must accompany each child in the water.

<u>Skills</u>: The first-timer will go through a wonderful experience with the use of water toys, songs and games. We will cover gliding, kicking and floating.

Parent/Child

Requirements: Ages 2 to 5 years

An adult must accompany each child in the water.

Skills: This class will guide you in how to work with your child to develop swim readiness skills. Songs, games and toys will be used to teach such skills as floating, gliding, kicking, submersion, and arm strokes.

Older Beginner

Requirements: Ages 10 to 14 years

Skills: Our new program is for swimmers who need to work on beginner skills and are not comfortable in the younger children's swim lessons. The goals for the program are to develop swim skills, become more comfortable in the water, and overcome their fear, while having fun with their peers.

Preschool

Requirements: Ages 4 to 6 years

Child must be able to submerge head.

Skills: Learn buoyancy and breath control, floating and kicking on front and back, gliding, arm strokes, entering and exiting the water and safety skills.



Level 1 - Intro to Water Skills

Requirements: Ages 6 to 14 years & Passed Preschool

Skills: Refine skills in buoyancy and breath control, supported floating and recovery on front and back, introduction to arm and leg action on front, back and side, safety and emergency fundamentals.

Level 2 - Fundamental Water Skills

Requirements: Ages 6 to 14 years & Passed Level 1

Skills: Breath control and submersion, underwater swimming, buoyancy on front and back, changing directions and positions, treading water, swim on front, back, side, and learn to help others.

Level 3 - Stroke Development

Requirements: Ages 7 to 14 years & Passed Level 2

<u>Skills:</u> Students will refine deep water entry and exit, submerge and retrieve objects, rotary breathing, survival float, front and back crawl, butterfly, and treading water.

Level 4 - Stroke Improvement

Requirements: Ages 8 to 14 years & Passed Level 3

Skills: Dive from side of pool, swim under water three body lengths, breast stroke, front crawl, butterfly, elementary back stroke, compact jump with life jacket and diving safety.

Level 5 - Stroke Refinement

Requirements: Ages 10 to 14 years & Passed Level 4

Skills: Perfect front crawl, back crawl, breast stroke, and butterfly, swimming under water, open/flip turns - front and back, pike and tuck dives, survival swimming and rescue breathing.

Regner Park Beach is West Bend's only outdoor swimming facility. The man-made pond is completely surrounded by sandy beach, and has a floating raft equipped with a diving board and slide. Lifeguards are on duty during operational hours.

Adjacent to the beach is the Rotary Splash Pad, a zero-depth water feature (no standing water). Participants are required to purchase a wristband at the beach house during operating hours. Proper swim attire is required.

The Rotary Splash Pad remains open through Labor Day.

Closing Policy: Hours may change depending upon weather conditions. In the event of rain or cold weather or when it is apparent that there will be little or no participation, the water will be cleared and the beach will be closed. Swimming is not allowed when the beach is closed. For questions please call the beach house at 335-5087.

### PARK RENTAL FACILITIES

The City of West Bend has multiple park facilities available to rent. Reservations for 2022 are now being accepted. You may reserve facilities online at https://webtrac.ci.west-bend.wi.us or call the department at 335-5080.

### **REGNER PARK**

800 N. Main Street

All Regner Park facilities are available to rent from the third weekend of April through the first weekend in October.

#### **Entertainment Area**

A large multi-use, festival area with restrooms, a fully functional raised and covered stage, a center pavilion and two full-service food buildings that can accommodate large events. The buildings within the Entertainment area are available to rent separately or as a group, and all are located very close to parking, the beach, splash pad and two large playgrounds. See complete descriptions below.

#### **Rotary & Kiwanis Concession Stands**

Two separate concession stands that are attached to the Pavilion, and available for rent with the pavilion. Each concession stand has 14 electrical outlets, stainless steel sinks, a countertop area that encircles the entire stand, a refrigerator/ freezer plus a free-standing chest freezer. Stands are available to rent individually or together. The stage is covered and theatrically powered.



#### **Picnic Groves**

Each grove has 10 picnic tables, a grill (area #6 has electricity) and all are located near the beach and park activity areas. Picnic groves may be reserved for a nominal fee. Swimming and Splash Pad admission are not included in any rental fees, but you may purchase beach and splash pad admissions for your party in advance by calling 262-335-5080.

### **Quaas Creek Park**

### 2500 Country Creek Circle

Enclosed air-conditioned meeting room contains 5 banquet tables, chairs to seat 30 people, plus a small kitchen with a stove, oven, refrigerator/freezer, sink, and counter. Also included with this rental is an upper, outside covered deck with 10 picnic tables accommodating 100 people, the exclusive use of a softball diamond, and a covered, ground level outdoor seating area for 40. Available the third weekend in April through the third weekend in October.

#### Strachota Bandstand

Overlooking the beach, Splashpad and Entertainment Area, the two-tiered Gazebo accommodates 120 people and includes 18 picnic tables and electric outlets.



#### Camp Lodge

Charming enclosed shelter that accommodates 49 people plus additional tables for serving. Includes a renovated kitchen area with stove, refrigerator, sink with cold water only, newly renovated restroom, hardwood floors, a natural fireplace, a large private grassy knoll, 15 picnic tables and a private parking lot.



#### **Centennial Shelter**

Located on the southern edge of the park, near Silverbrook Dr. and bordering scenic Silver Creek, the large open shelter will accommodate 150+ people and includes 15 picnic tables, grill, lights and electricity. Restrooms, playgrounds, tennis courts and the baseball stadium are nearby.



### **Riverside Park** 800 Kilbourn Avenue

Year-round use enclosed building with tables and chairs to seat 55 people. Includes a kitchen area with stove, refrigerator, hot and cold water, restrooms, gas fireplace, large outside deck with 8 picnic tables, and a parking lot that is adjacent to the building. Playground, a youth baseball diamond, basketball courts, tennis courts, sand volleyball courts, football and soccer fields, and Milwaukee River fishing are all located nearby. Available year-round.

### **Ridge Run Park**

Accessible restrooms, free parking, water and playground equipment are all within close proximity to each of the rental buildings. ### WEST ENTRANCE

Access via W. Washington St. to Scenic Drive, then south to Wheat Ridge Lane & park entrance

#### **Pick Pavilion**

A large open shelter accommodating groups up to 200 is nestled in a forest of mature trees with 25 picnic tables, a large grill, and a 10' long serving counter equipped with electrical outlets.



#### **Meadow Shelter**

 $(\mathbf{\Phi})$ 

Surrounded by a meadow and mature shade trees, the open shelter accommodates 60 people at eight picnic tables. There are two electrical outlets, and one large grill.



### Jim & Ann White Family Cabin

Under mature shade trees with drive-up/drop-off access, the charming cabin seats 49 people (49 chairs and 10 banquet tables). There is a 6' long serving counter, refrigerator, freezer, heat and electricity.



### **EAST ENTRANCE**
