## Taraska left mark at Arrowhead

Longtime P.E. teacher, coach died in car accident

rrowhead High School and its proud academic and athletic programs lost a great friend and ambassador on Oct. 15 with the unexpected passing of longtime physical education teacher and Hall of Fame football coach Tom Taraska, 71.

Taraska was reportedly killed in a one-vehicle car accident. The Waukesha County Sheriff's Department was notified at 4:41 p.m. of the crash on Rybeck Road near Woodfield Court. The vehicle was traveling eastbound when it left the roadway and struck a tree. The 71-year-old driver was pronounced deceased on scene, the sheriff's department said.


Taraska made his high school coaching mark at Arrowhead shortly after being named the school's head coach on May 10, 1982. He previously was the varsity head coach at Franklin before taking the Arrowhead job.

He coached the Warhawks for 29 consecutive years and turned the once average AHS program into the premier football program in Wisconsin.

Before he retired on May 10, 2010, he led Arrowhead to a remarkable four state championships (1993, 1994, 1996, 2007) and five second-place finishes (2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2008). One season in that run his program had 250 kids playing high school football.

"Tom was a great football coach, leader and teacher," said his best friend, Jim LaVoi, who played quarterback for Taraska in 1986, 1987 and 1988 and then joined his staff as an assistant in 1993. "He was a great community leader and person. He encouraged kids to play multiple sports, and at one time went to 29 straight conference track meets as a spectator. He was just an incredible leader. Not everyone liked Tom but everyone respected him."





While at AHS, Taraska not only piled up all kinds of state and conference championships but also finished with 265 wins and just 96 losses.

"When athletic director and former football coach Dave Balmer hired Tom he told Dave right from the start that his goal at Arrowhead was to win state championships," LaVoi added. "It took him 11 years to win that first one but he had a blueprint for the program as soon as he took over. He had a special passion for not only football, but for Arrowhead. It's unbelievable what he all did for the school."

Nick Hayden, arguably the best football player in school history, played four years under Taraska and went on to play at the University of Wisconsin. From there Hayden was drafted by the Carolina Panthers in the NFL before finishing his football career as a starting defensive tackle for the Dallas Cowboys.

"In my time playing for Tom at Arrowhead I developed a strong bond with him," Hayden said. "He never treated me as a superstar player or somebody that was special. I was just one of the guys with him. That's the way he treated every guy on the team. He taught us that it took everybody to win championships, not just a few guys. He was a mentor to me both on and off the field. I wouldn't be the man I am today if it wasn't for Tom Taraska. He taught me how to be the best football player I could be and also the best person I could be. He helped me a lot with both. Things are tough right now for a lot of people with his passing.

When Taraska retired, he had the most state championship game appearances and most playoff victories (47) in WIAA history. In his 29 years as head coach, he led the Warhawks to

20 playoff appearances.

Accolades were plenty for the popular AHS coach. In 2004 he was inducted into the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association and in 2008 he was inducted into the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh Hall of Fame. In 2007 he was named the Associated Press Coach of the Year. He also was honored in 2009 when the stadium was named Taraska Stadium in his honor.

He played wide receiver while at college at UW-Oshkosh and earned a bachelor's degree from


there and a master's degree later from UW-Whitewater. He is survived by his longtime wife, Sue Anne.

The Arrowhead School District posted the following statement on social media:

"The Arrowhead High School community is saddened to share the loss of one of our Arrowhead family. Long-time teacher and football coaching legend, Tom Taraska, died early yesterday evening. Tom was a passionate and successful educator and football coach, a great advocate of our school, and had a personality that was unmatched. He had a huge influence on Arrowhead, and was a titan in the football community across the state of Wisconsin and beyond. Coach Taraska inspired and motivated hundreds of student-athletes during his time at AHS. His contributions to Arrowhead and the Hartland area were immense. He will be missed by

n the early 20th century, American banks wanted to build consumers' trust in financial institutions and recruit additional customers. One technique used for newly opened accounts, the depositor would receive a "Still Penny Bank" as an advertising gift. Parents used this promotional opportunity as a teaching tool for their children and banking executives recruited many more clients.

Interest in coin banks became so popular that department stores and tourist attractions designed and sold their own models. Foundries supplied the demand using leftover cast-iron offcuts for these new product lines. The smallest scraps become toy soldiers and Boy Scout figurines etc. Photo 1 current fair market value in good condition is \$65.

A different kind of bank was used for prizes at early carnivals. This parrot, in photo 2, is chalk and it is a survivor! These fragile banks had only one slot to insert coins (no exit hole). They often broke when people tried to retrieve their money. Current fair market value in good condition is \$25.

Eventually, shapes of penny banks varied from buildings, to clocks, cars, animals and more. The value of the train station bank, in photo 3, is \$55.

Photo 4 is an example of another bank promotional item. These are more common and their design mimicked the "new" transistor radio. A current fair market value in good condition is about


