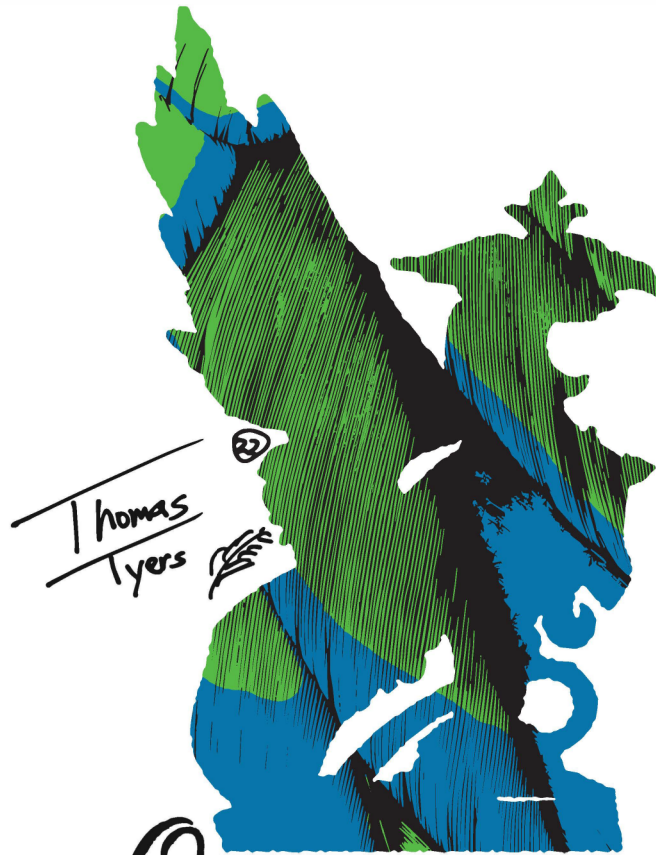

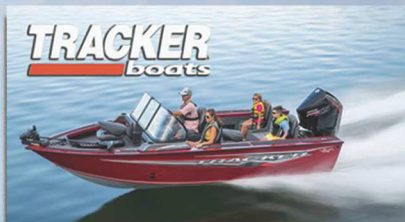

2023 Festival Facts

The Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts:

- Is a non-profit organization
- Has been in existence for 52 years
- Administers a non-subsidized, self-supporting annual budget
- Pays an Oconomowoc city park fee for the use of Fowler Park
- Is governed by an all-volunteer Board of Directors
- Presents generous scholarship awards annually

Artists from around the country:

- Apply for only 110 available spaces in the Festival
- Submit applications using the ZAPP process by computer
- Pay a flat fee to exhibit in the show. No percentage of their sales is shared
- Compete for awards in the following categories: Best of Show; Ceramics; Drawing/Pastels/Printmaking; Fiber/Leather; Glass; Jewelry; Mixed Media 2D; Mixed Media 3D; Painting; Photography; Sculpture; Wood

More than 500 local community volunteers:

- Provide security for the park
- Act as hosts and hostesses during the Festival
- Provide food & drink under the direction of local churches & service clubs
- Coordinate 30 hours of mostly volunteer entertainment on three stages
- Entertain nearly 1,000 young people each year in the Children's Area
- Provide free shuttle bus service to and from the Festival
- Provide free pontoon shuttle from City Hall pier to Festival grounds
- House artists in their homes if requested
- Furnish a picnic buffet for all participating artists

Scholarship Fund

Over the years, the Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts has given away more than \$200,000 in scholarships to local students pursuing studies in the fine arts – visual and performing.

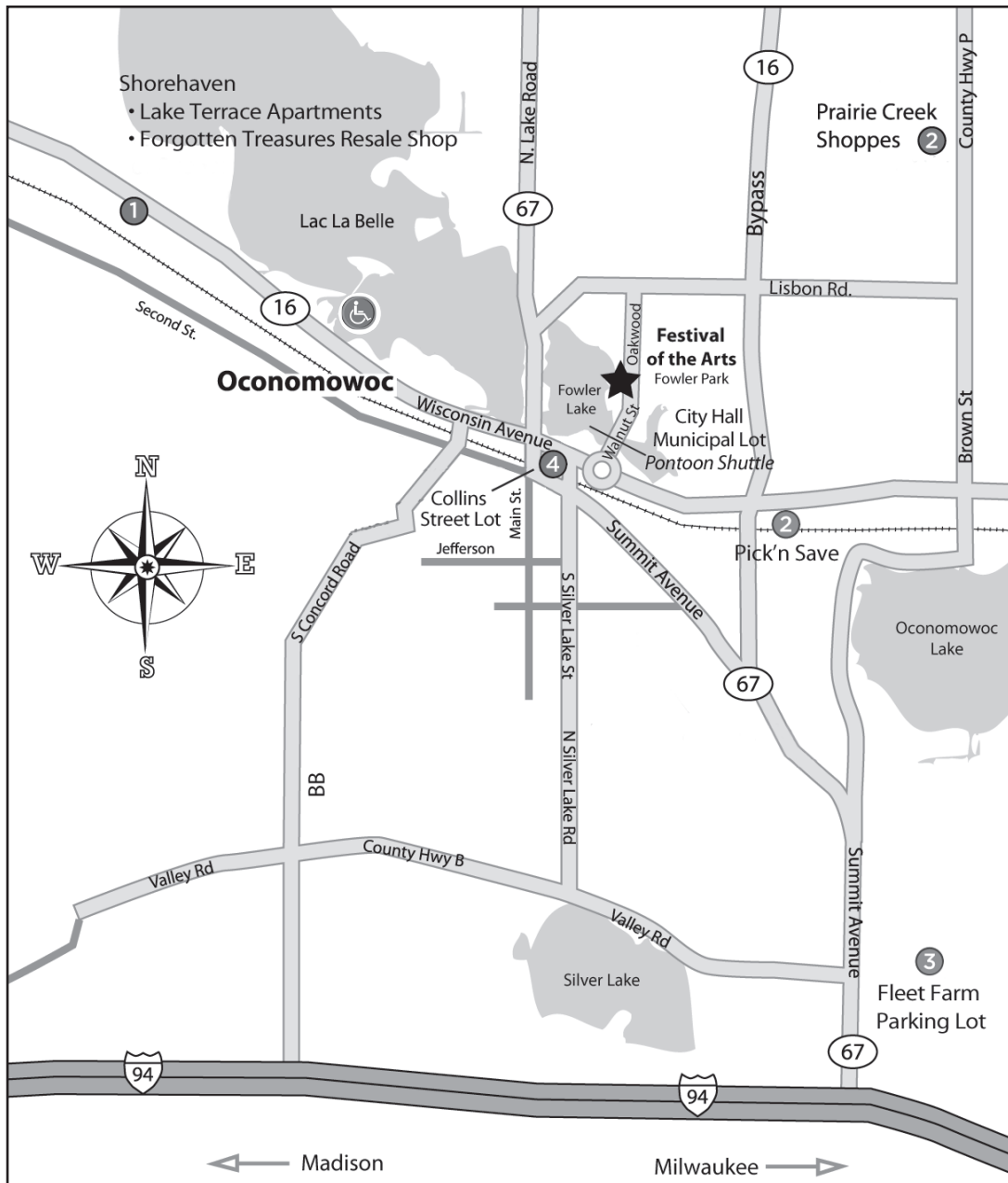

Exciting Lake Action

Once again this year a free pontoon shuttle to the Festival will be available. Pontoon shuttle every 20 minutes from the city boat launch just north of City Hall across Fowler Lake to the festival grounds at Fowler Park, and then back again after your visit. The shuttle is provided this year compliments of the Boat House in Nashotah. When you visit them you will see their newly remodeled showroom and maintenance facility.

Look for Light up the Lakes, an annual Venetian boat parade held on Lac La Belle in conjunction with Festival Week. Beautifully lit boats circle the lake at dusk, to the delight of the many spectators. This year's parade will take place at City Beach on Saturday, August 19, following the 7:30 p.m. concert by the American Legion Band. A fireworks display will end the evening.

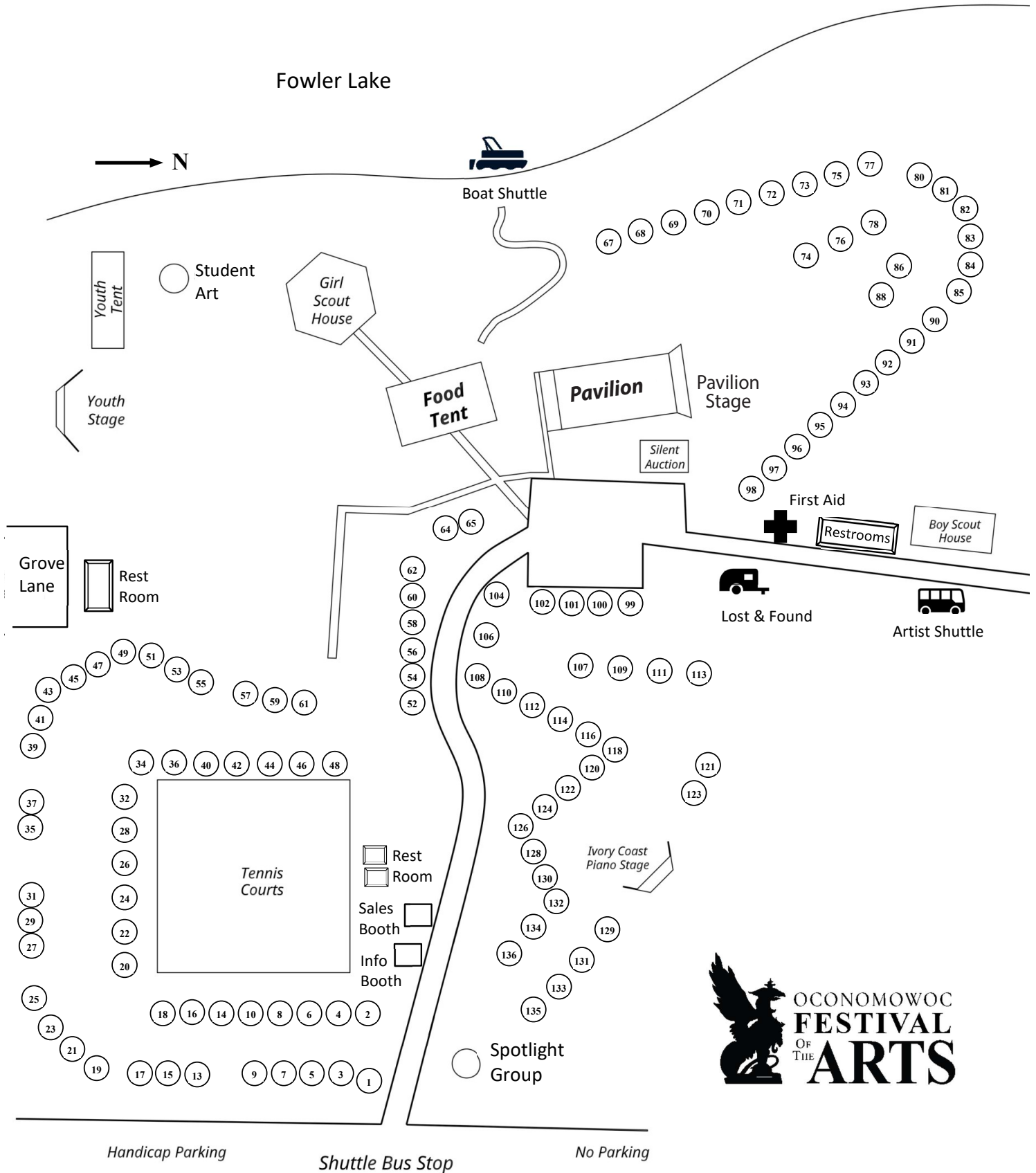

Kyra Davies: Kyra received the 2023 Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts - Virginia Harris Memorial Scholarship. She reflects that she has always loved art: drawing, painting, or creating. Beyond her high school courses, she has spent over 3200 hours working as a student intern for Kit Co. Atelier as a student intern creating customer formal wear. She is

also an accomplished musician playing multiple instruments: violin, ukulele, piano and guitar. She is an extremely talented, diligent, and empathetic student. Her desire for direct and specific feedback is important to her as it has helped her grow as an artist. Academically, Kyra is an honor student. In the fall, Kyra will attend the Milwaukee Institute of Arts and Design to pursue a double major in illustration and fashion design.



Josiah Hooper: Josiah received the 2023 Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts - John Rawlins Scholarship. Through the encouragement of a friend and his family, he conquered his stage fright to begin participating in the Oconomowoc High School theater program in his sophomore year and became "hooked." He played Oberon in Midsummer

Night's Dream in his last production. He is a respectful and curious young man who is a quiet but firm leader among his peers. His accomplishments academically include the National Honor Society, Mu Alpha Theater, and the International Thespian Society. Josiah will attend UW-Whitewater in the fall to study theater education as he hopes to inspire the next generation of young actors to overcome their stage fright.



Aderyn Seefeldt: Aderyn received an Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts - Fine Arts Scholarship. She comes from a musical family and recalls spending her childhood in a diverse musical environment, everything from church hymns to Billy Joel. She began playing the French horn in middle school and has gone on to be principal horn as a senior. She is a

member of the WDMA State Honors Project Band, a member of the Milwaukee Youth Symphony and was a finalist for the UW Madison Tuition Audition competition. Aderyn's creative interests extend beyond the French horn. She is in the Concert Choir, theater productions and ventured into AP Art and Design courses her senior year. She will attend the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point in the fall to study music education.



Lauren Kost: Lauren received an Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts - Fine Arts Scholarship. Her talents include theater, music (violin), visual arts, and dance. Lauren's accolades in theater include the Jerry's (Wisconsin) where she was nominated for Best Lead Actress as Donna Sheridan in Mama Mia as well as multiple awards for the Oconomowoc

High School Ivy Awards. In her junior year, she painted a large-scale acrylic with sixty-six prom fashions throughout history which was displayed in the art center for the event. She is described as a leader with a gentle spirit, who is always encouraging, optimistic, kind, and sincere. Lauren will attend Liberty University in Virginia to pursue a BFA in acting.

The awards ceremony is the culmination of the festival, and it is wonderful to see the artists rewarded for their creativity and dedication to their artistic vision. Artists awards are presented in the following categories: Best of Category – ceramics, drawing/pastels/printmaking, fiber/leather, glass, jewelry, mixed media 2d, mixed media 3d, painting, photography, sculpture and wood, and Best of Show.

In order to maintain a fresh perspective the judges change from year to year. Winning artists are extended an invitation to participate in next year's show.

The Festival of Arts is able to maintain a high caliber of art in our show because it is juried, meaning that as part of the selection process artists must submit examples of their work, which is reviewed anonymously by an independent jury. Again, the jury changes from year to year. We are fortunate to have an abundance of talented and generous artists to serve as jurors and judges for the Festival.

Another important part of the Awards ceremony is the presentation of scholarships. Each year high school students attending Oconomowoc schools or residing in the district are given the opportunity to compete for several scholarships. Over the past 50 years, the Festival of the Arts has awarded over \$200,000 in scholarships to students intending to pursue careers in the arts.

2023 Artist Celebration

Once again, artists and volunteers of the Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts will gather for cocktails and appetizers while enjoying the lively music of TaleSpin, followed by an outdoor buffet and announcement of awards.

This year's celebration will take place at Shorehaven's Lakefront Pavilion, on the shores of Lac La Belle. The Festival sends heartfelt thanks to TaleSpin and Shorehaven.

2023 Cover Artist Thomas Tyers

This year's 2023 Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts cover was created by Thomas Tyers who received the 2023 Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts Award in his category of wood. Thomas is a native of Oshkosh, now living in Omro, Wisconsin. He has been carving wildfowl for 50 years. His work now tries to skillfully display just one feather, butterfly, or the colorful beauty of feather compositions. His art pieces are carved from Basswood and painted in acrylics using various techniques.

Throughout his career, he has won over 200 awards in the United States and Canada. Thomas has done over 1000 pieces in his time as a carver, starting with miniature decoys given as gifts to family and friends to full size birds such as Red-Tailed Hawks and Snowy Egrets.

Thomas learned to carve from Oshkosh native John Ryan who was taught by Frank Strey, who was a famous Lake Winnebago decoy carver. In 1991 and 2016 he was featured along with the works of John James Audubon at the Paine Art Center of Oshkosh. His works are in the collections of President Jimmy Carter, Dr. Jane Goodall, and Dr. George Archibald.

FESTIVAL JUDGES

Stephen Perkins

Born in London, Dr. Stephen Perkins is an Emeritus Curator of Art, University of Wisconsin-Green Bay. He emigrated to the USA in 1980 and completed an MA in Art at San Francisco State University studying with the visual anthropologist John Collier Jr..

After ten years involvement with the San Francisco alternative art scene, he moved to Iowa City to pursue a PhD in Art History at the University of Iowa-Iowa City, with a dissertation on Artists' periodicals receiving his PhD in 2003. In 2000, he accepted the position of curator of art at the Lawton Gallery, University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, where he remained until 2015.

Recent activities include a one-person exhibition at the Watrous Gallery in Madison titled Stephen Perkins: Mining the Archive: Subspace Works and Artists' Accordion Books, February 10 – April 9, 2023.

Lillian Sizemore

Lillian Sizemore pursued a life-long career in the arts after graduating in Fine Art, Printmaking, and Italian at Indiana University-Bloomington in 1980. She works across disciplines from graphic design and photography, to mosaic and arts administration. Her writing has been published in RawVision, Wisconsin People & Ideas, and Mosaïque, among others.

She lived for 25 years in San Francisco, where she began researching the twentieth century mosaic movement employing her expertise as a maker with a passion for mosaic in the built environment. She taught at the Institute of Mosaic Art in Oakland, and from 2013-2016 she lived in London pursuing further arts research at The Prince's Foundation School of Traditional Arts.

In 2021-22 she was awarded a Madison Arts Commission Blink Grant to build a temporary land art project; "How Lovely Are Thy Branches" an 89-foot diameter walking labyrinth made from crowdsourced holiday pine trees. Her website is LillianSizemore.com

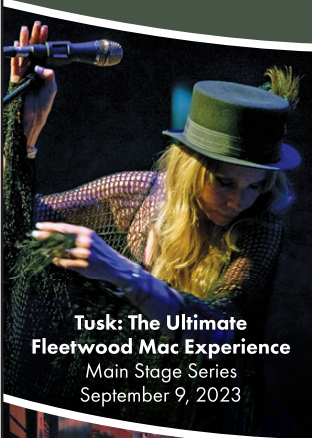
