2024 Festival Facts

The Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts:

- Is a non-profit organization
- Has been in existence for 53 years
- Administers a non-subsidized, self-supporting annual budget
- Pays an Oconomowoc city park fee for the use of Fowler Park
- Is governed by an all-volunteer Board of Directors
- Presents generous scholarship awards annually

Artists from around the country:

- Apply for only 110 available spaces in the Festival
- Submit applications using the ZAPP process by computer
- Pay a flat fee to exhibit in the show. No percentage of their sales is shared
- Compete for awards in the following categories: Best of Show; Ceramics; Drawing/Pastels/Printmaking; Fiber/Leather; Glass; Jewelry; Mixed Media 2D; Mixed Media 3D; Painting; Photography; Sculpture; Wood

More than 500 local community volunteers:

- Provide security for the park
- Act as hosts and hostesses during the Festival
- Provide food & drink under the direction of local churches & service clubs
- Coordinate 30 hours of mainly volunteer entertainment on three stages
- Entertain nearly 1,000 young people each year in the Children's Area
- Provide free shuttle bus service to and from the Festival
- Provide free pontoon shuttle from City Hall pier to Festival grounds
- House artists in their homes if requested
- Furnish a picnic buffet for all participating artists

Scholarship Fund

Over the years, the Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts has given away more than \$200,000 in scholarships to local students pursuing studies in the fine arts – visual and performing.

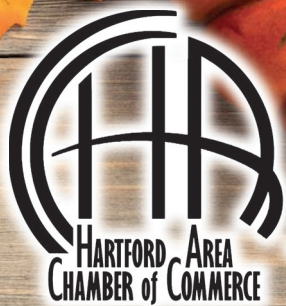

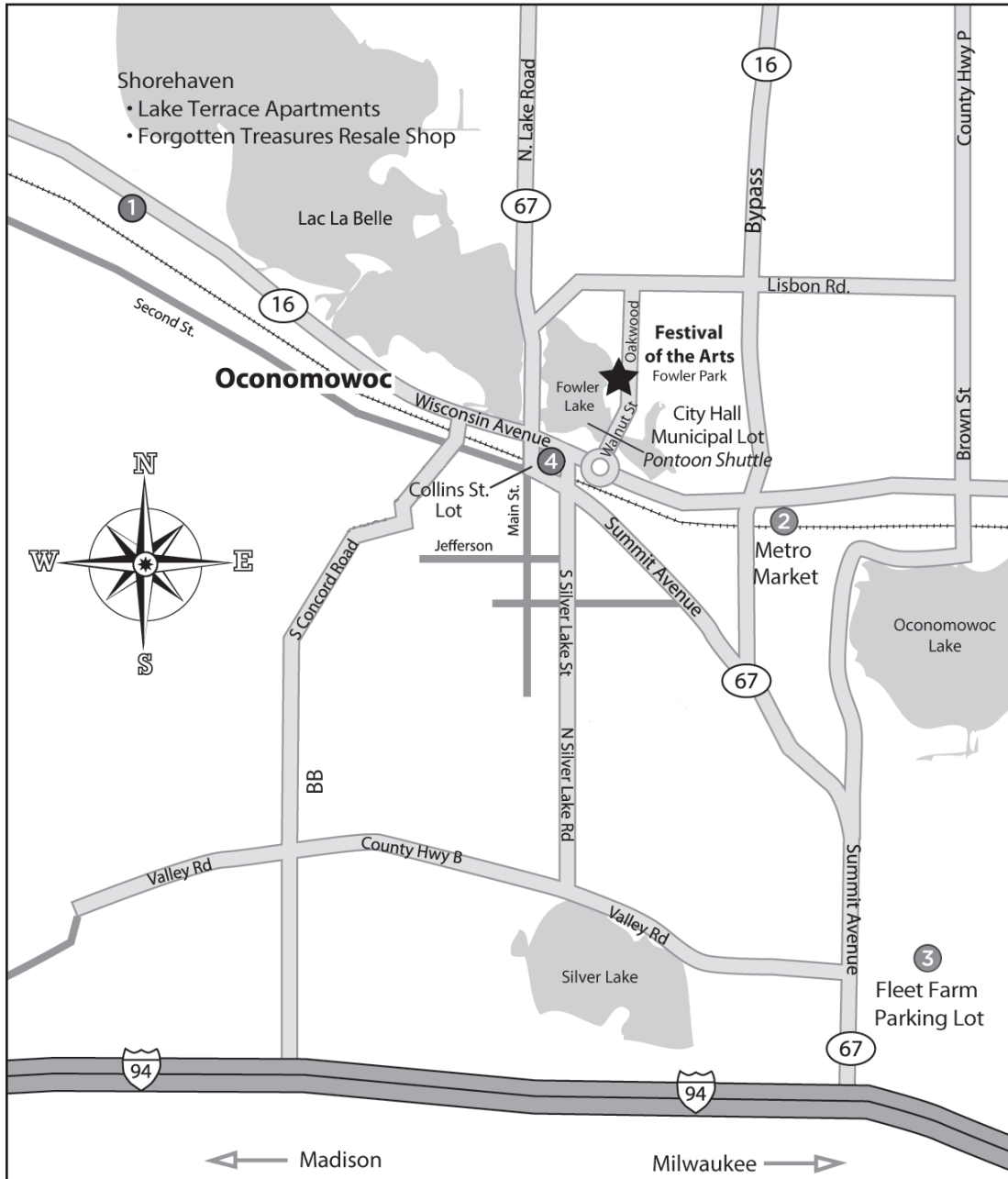

Exciting Lake Action

Once again this year a free pontoon shuttle to the Festival will be available. Pontoon shuttle every 20 minutes from the city boat launch just north of City Hall across Fowler Lake to the festival grounds at Fowler Park, and then back again after your visit. The shuttle is provided this year compliments of the Boat House in Nashotah. When you visit them you will see their newly remodeled showroom and maintenance facility.

Look for Light up the Lakes, an annual Venetian boat parade held on Lac La Belle in conjunction with Festival Week. Beautifully lit boats circle the lake at dusk, to the delight of the many spectators. This year's parade will take place at City Beach on Saturday, August 17, following the 7:30 p.m. concert by the American Legion Band. A fireworks display will end the evening.

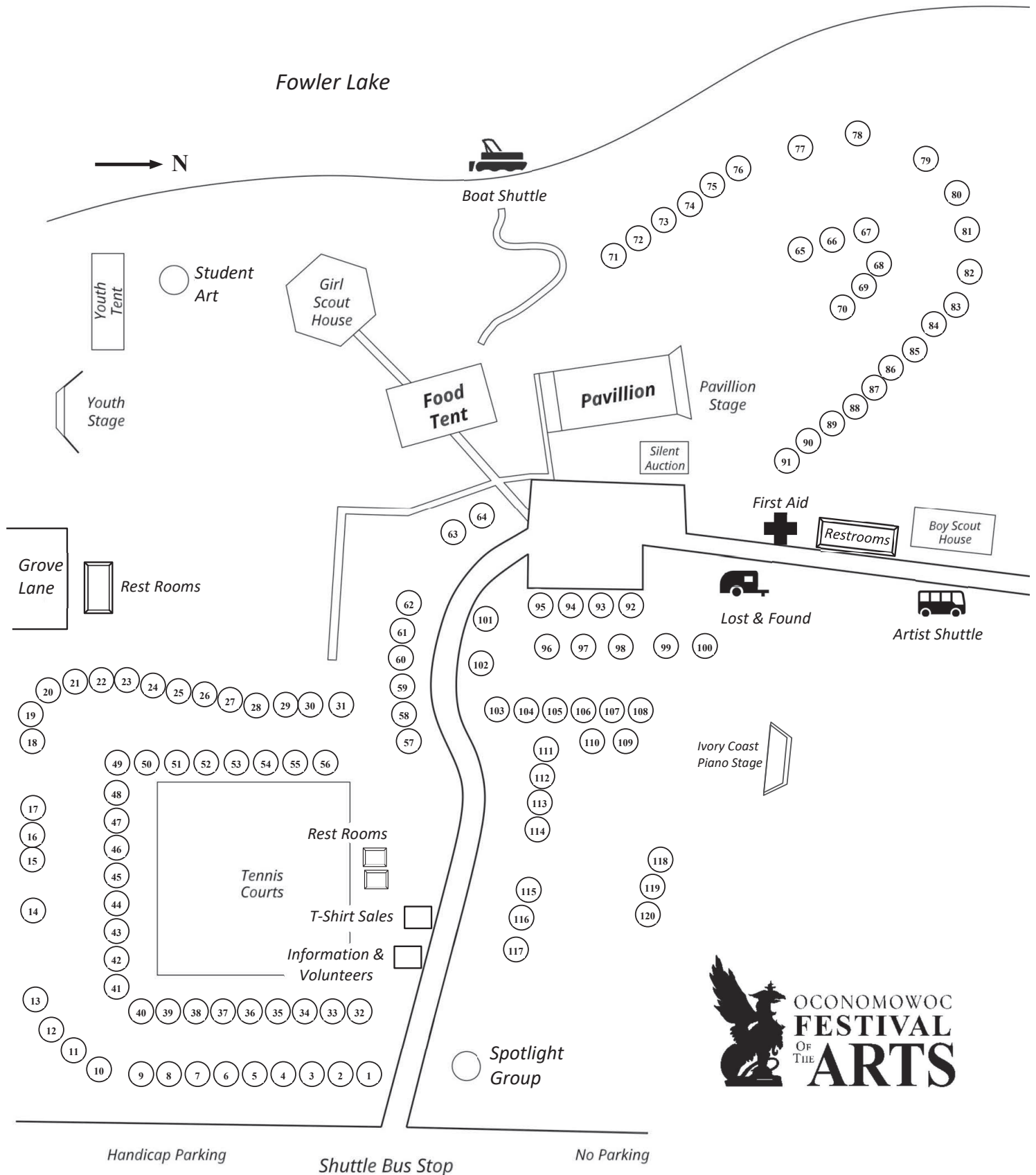

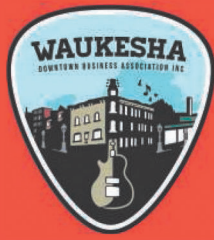

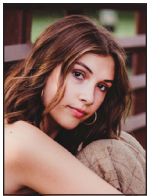
Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts Scholarships: 2024

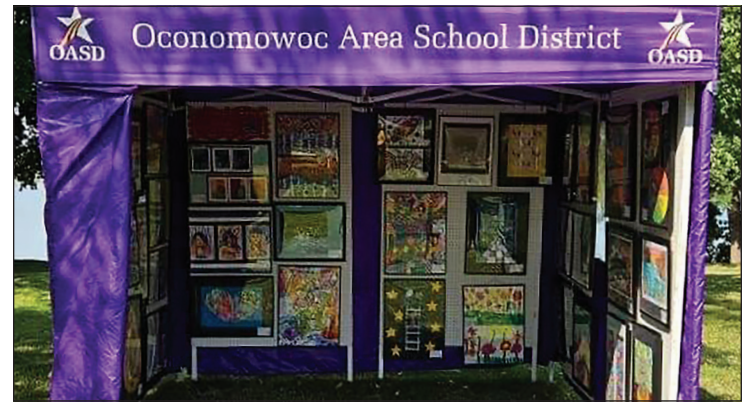

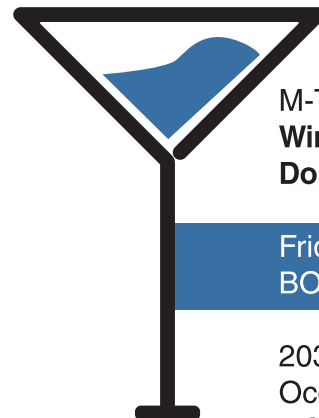

Be sure to catch the Festival Awards ceremony Sunday at 1:00 p.m. on the Pavilion Stage. The awards ceremony is the culmination of the jurying process, and it is wonderful to see the artists rewarded for their creativity and dedication to their artistic vision. Artists awards are presented in the following categories: Best of Category – ceramics, drawing/pastels/printmaking, fiber/leather, glass, jewelry, mixed media 2d, mixed media 3d, painting, photography, sculpture and wood, and Best of Show.

In order to maintain a fresh perspective the judges change from year to year. Winning artists are extended an invitation to participate in next year's show.

The Festival of Arts is able to maintain a high caliber of art in our show because it is juried, meaning that as part of the selection process artists must submit examples of their work, which is reviewed anonymously by an independent jury.

Another important part of the Awards ceremony is the presentation of scholarships. Each year high school students attending Oconomowoc schools or residing in the district are given the opportunity to compete for several scholarships. Over the past 50 years, the Festival of the Arts has awarded over \$200,000 in scholarships to students intending to pursue careers in the arts.

The designer of this year's Festival of the Arts design is 17-year-old Oconomowoc High School Junior Paul Alcazar. Born and raised in Oconomowoc, Paul has spent many years practicing, experimenting, and exploring various media and methods. Whether in the margins of school papers or the pages of lined notebooks, Paul chases growth. Some of his artwork from middle school has been featured in the student art tent for OFA.

In the present day, he continues practicing in whatever way possible. With canvases ranging from the side of his garage- to small 6x6 inch wooden squares, his works aim to capture the complex forms of beasts, animals, humans, and more. He used his AP art class to explore the idea of a monster and his ceramics class to capture the passive nature of a gorilla, a sculpture that would be featured in the student section at the Milwaukee Art Museum. He also worked with many clients in his design challenge class, even designing and illustrating the poster for the OHS production "Once Upon a Mattress".

When creating the design, Paul prioritized simplicity, and visual homage to the Wizard of Oz. Although graphic design may not be his main facet of creativity- the challenge was welcomed with open arms and the hopes of making a well-liked image representing the Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts. Paul enjoys client work and the process of iteration and design overall. This has led to pathways like concept art and illustration being ones he will pursue.

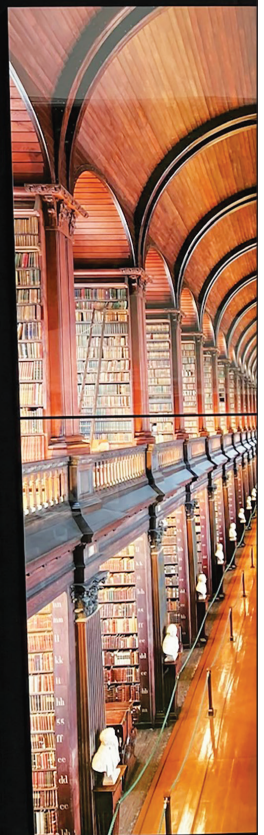
