Weissgerber's Gasthaus to return with a booth at the fair

New food vendors selling Venezuelan cuisine, brisket and root beer floats

WAUKESHA – If you enjoy eating your way through the fair, this year's Waukesha County Fair has plenty of returning food vendors, along with new ones, serving fair favorites and some new flavors.

New this year is Weissgerber's Gasthaus. The stand will pay homage to the longtime Waukesha restaurant that served German fare, but which closed in 2016 after 33 years in business. Dishes to be sold at the fair include Ussinger's sausages (smoked brat, original brat or all beef wiener) on a bun with sauerkraut, the Wurst Platter (all three sausages with potato salad and sauerkraut), curry wurst, landjaeger, schnitzel, hunter's schnitzel, Reuben rolls, Bavarian pretzel and apple strudel.

Lisa Weissgerber Marks said her family was approached a few years ago about having a food booth at the fair after having sold German food at the Oconomowoc German Christmas Market. This year, they felt like having a booth at the fair would be doable.

She said the booth will be like a "nostalgic memory" for those who loved going to the Gasthaus in Waukesha.

Two other new vendors to the fair this year also selling ethnic food are Empanadas Palace and TacomeX. Empanadas Palace will offer Venezuelan food, including

arepas, pabellon bowl, tequechesse, cachapas, desserts, and empanadas, of course.

TacomeX's menu has burritos, tacos, quesadilla, churros, elotes, nacho supreme, quesabirria, flautas and horchata.

New vendors offering cool-down options are Isa's Ice Cream and Root Beer MKE. Isa's Ice Cream will also have sorbet for sale in a variety of flavors. In addition to root beer floats, Root Beer MKE will have thirst-quenching beverages and ice cream sundaes.

Selling a fair food favorite, Kettle Cornucopia offers kettle corn as well as flavored popcorn and fresh-squeezed lemonade.

Pink Heifer, also new to the fair this year, will offer a variety of craveable foods, such as Wagon Rolls (brisket and cheddar egg rolls with Carolina gold dipping sauce), mac 'n cheese, optional with pork or brisket, fried bella mushrooms, pulled pork and brisket sandwiches.

Chick fil A will also have a booth for the first time at the fair with sandwiches, nuggets, salads, chips, wraps, fruit cups, cookies and iced tea all on the menu.

However, if you simply want a standby favorite such as a corndog or a corn on the cob, the Waukesha County Fair will have those too, as well as hamburgers, deep fried cheese curds, pizza and fried food on a stick. A lot of hard work goes into it, teen says about showing animals

Emma Keene, 16, has shown animals for six years

WAUKESHA - After six years of showing sheep at the Waukesha County Fair, Emma Keene is ready for her first Junior Livestock Auction where she will show three beef heifers. She is excited to be able to put her animals out there and showcase them to fairgoers.

“A lot of hard work goes into it. It is really rewarding to show off your animals,” Keene said.

According to the fair's website, the Junior Livestock Auction is the culmination of a year's project for 4-H and FFA members. These young men and women have selected, fed and groomed a steer, lamb, poultry, rabbit, goat or pig as a learning and business venture.

The project is brought to the fair to be judged, graded and sold. Support of the auction provides recognition for young adults to earn college funds, purchase more animals and receive practical training in business and agriculture. Buyers can support a young person in the community by purchasing an animal. Animals may be resold if buyers do not wish to take delivery of the meat.

Emma and her sisters, Jordan and Sophia, became involved in the fair after a

friend from Shepherd of the Hills Church had a request. The friend, who aged out of showing, owned a sheep farm and asked the Keene girls and other teens if they wanted to show sheep at the fair.

“We said we would give it a try and quickly fell in love with it,” Keene said.

The sisters enjoyed working with the animals and showcasing them to others at the fair.

Keene doesn't own the animals she shows but raises and works with them.

“Raising livestock is like raising a pet. They need food, water and a well-kept place to live,” Keene said.

When they are first born, they hold them a couple times a week to get them used to people. When they start getting bigger, they start taking them out and begin training with the animals.

“Now that we are getting close to the fair, we are going a few times a week,” she said.

They train the animals to become comfortable being around people as the fair is visited by a ton of people. When animals are born, they are on a farm with other animals. When they see an abundance of new people, it can be scary so it is important to train and prepare them.

To raise an animal, according to Keene, it is important to have patience and work hard.

“Showing livestock takes up a lot of time.

You need to have patience with your animal because they all progress at different rates,” she said.

A challenge for the 16-year-old is when her animals don't cooperate or give her a hard time when working with them.

“It's good to remember every animal has their differences and it is important to pick up on those and work with them in the way you train them. Every animal will improve and progress at a different rate,” Keene said.

The program helps people like Keene learn about the industry and where they get their food from.

Another challenge that she has learned to overcome is learning to let go. It is hard at first to see an animal you raised go to someone else.

“If it is your first time, it can be hard since it is something you are not used to. You have to learn this is the business of it and this is what they are raised to be. They are raised to feed others so you just kind of have to accept it,” she said.

Keene hopes to continue raising animals until she ages out of the program.

“It is something that I love and my favorite hobby,” she said.

Keene aspires to become a nurse and hopefully live on a farm one day.

“I've grown to love this and the lifestyle,” Keene said.

Waukesha County Fair offers headliner lineup for all ears

Atkins, Daughtry, Michaels to grace Main Stage

WAUKESHA — If you don't need nothing but a good time, the 182nd Waukesha County Fair has that base covered and then some, with an array of headliners catering to just about all ears this year on the Miller Lite Main Stage.

First up will be country superstar Rodney Atkins at 8 p.m. July 18. Atkins was named the Top New Male Vocalist at the 2006 ACM Awards, and his single "Watching You" was the Number One Song of the Decade, according to Country Aircheck.

The platinum-selling artist is touring in support of his album "Caught Up in the Country."

According to information supplied by the Waukesha County Fair, with six No. 1 singles, eight Top 5 singles, and 3.8 billion streams in his career, Atkins is recognized as one of the most powerful voices in country music. Rockers Daughtry will take the state at 8 p.m. July 19. Their debut album, the self-titled "Daughtry," was the top-selling album of 2007, producing four platinum-selling

singles on the Billboard Hot 100 and became the fastest-selling debut rock album in Soundscan history. It was also nominated for four Grammy Awards and won four American Music Awards and seven Billboard Music Awards including Album of the Year, the county fair said.

To date the band has sold over nine million albums and 16 million singles around the world.

The Bret Michael Parti-Gras Tour headlines the Main Stage at 8 p.m. July 20. The front man of Poison has gone on to star in reality TV and continues to tour after selling 100 million records.

"We couldn't be more thrilled to have Bret Michaels take the stage at the Waukesha County Fair for an unbelievable night of good vibes and true rock and roll memories.

Bret always brings an evening filled with excitement and unmatched energy. You never know what you'll see at a Bret Michaels show," Chrissy Gluege, the fair's executive director, said on the fair's website.

Michaels also is known for advocating for the military and their service and directing a key part of his mission to raising awareness of Type 1 Diabetes.

Tickets and VIP seating for all shows are still available. However, Elite VIP seating is sold out.

In addition, acts and activities are slated for the Leinie Lodge and Coors Light stages all throughout the fair.
