Stay in the shade between 10 AM and 2 PM when UV rays are strongest.

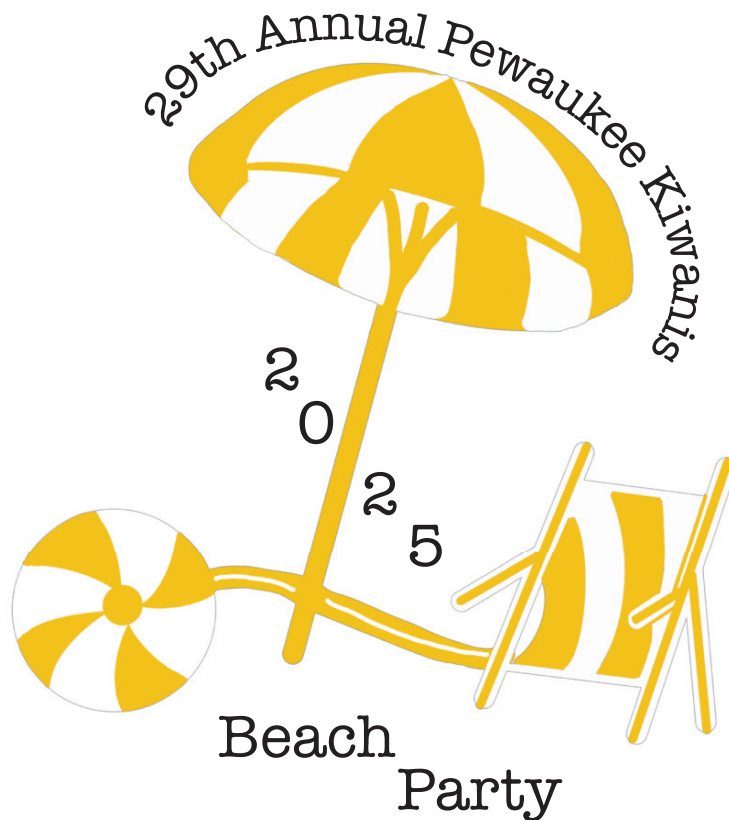
